- The AgZero2030 initiative was formed at a Nov 2019 form by WA farmers, primary industry organisations like DIPRD, Grain Industry Association of WA and community groups It aims share positive stories, information and research, to impact on policies that are impacting on farms, reduce the impacts of climate change on the sector and drive capacity for more landcare to happen. . It wants to do its job and make itself redundant.
